

RESIDENTIAL TOP TIPS



The DofE Residential section at Gold level is a unique opportunity to develop confidence and skills in an unfamiliar environment—but finding an opportunity that counts is crucial! This flyer will cover some common questions to help make sure you get the best from this exciting section.

WHAT TO DO

Activities need to be undertaken with the group as it needs to be a **shared experience**. As such one-to-one activities will not count. While music festivals do not count, community events can provided participants commit to full days of activity and remain with their group. Activities need to be based in learning, activity or service to others or the environment through an **organised group, registered charity or AAP**. You cannot use an activity organised by your own school or part of your curriculum.

Does it count?

Driving schools: **No**
Work experience: **No**
Music festivals: **No**
Charity/community festivals: **Yes**
Summer Schools and camps: **Yes**

WHERE TO STAY

Residentials need to be undertaken in a group with a minimum of **five** members, with whom you will work towards a shared goal, undertake organised evening activities, and stay with in **shared accommodation**. You must not have met any of these people previously (e.g. Scout camps count if **not** with your own group).

Does it count?

Home/family/individual stays: **No**
With staff known to you: **No**
School exchanges: **No**
Groups smaller than five: **No**
Group camping: **Yes**
Dorms: **Yes**
With those you spent the day with: **Yes**

WHO TO ASK

As with all sections you will need an **assessor**. They will need to provide personalised comments on your activity.

Does it count?

Certificate only: **No**
Relative/teacher known to you: **No**
Generic report for all participants: **No**
Personalised feedback: **Yes**
Assessor who interacted with you: **Yes**
